This includes a highly competitive gubernatorial race, a battle for the Illinois Supreme Court, and a best-in-the-nation chance to net a new Democratic member of Congress.

What Will You Do?

As the Organize Illinois 2022 GOTV Director, you will develop and execute a statewide Get Out the Vote plan to turn out Democrats across the state in support of, and in coordination with, Democratic candidates up and down the ballot in Illinois.

- Manage a team of GOTV staffers to assist in the preparation and execution of necessary GOTV programs, including packet production

- Work cross-departmentally to ensure that all departments are aligned around GOTV goals, Direct Voter Contact efforts and program needs
- Track and manage staging location and office preparedness for GOTV across the state
- Monitor and respond to all GOTV-related needs within the campaign
- Other duties as assigned

The ideal candidate will be a highly motivated and passionate promoter of Democratic values with experience managing organizers or volunteers on a Democratic campaign. You have experience working in a metric-driven voter contact program and are capable of synthesizing a wide array of regional priorities and incorporating them into a succinct and comprehensive plan.

- At least three cycles of statewide or competitive campaign experience;
- Previous management experience in a campaign setting;
- Exceptional organization and time management skills;
- Excellent data and analytical skills;
- Strong interpersonal skills and the ability to communicate effectively with people of different backgrounds;
- A passion for social justice and a commitment to Democratic Party values;
- Ability to work in a fast-paced, high-pressure environment;
- Sense of humor and solutions-oriented attitude;
- Ability to work long and irregular hours in a metric-driven environment;
- Ability to be flexible under pressure and meet tight deadlines;
- Proficiency with Votebuilder/VAN preferred, but not required;
